

# Ailwyn Cup

The Cup was presented to the Village by Lord Ailwyn in 1977, to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of H.M. Queen Elizabeth II. It is presented each year at the Parish Council Annual Parish Meeting to a person chosen by the Parish Council for exceptional service to the Community.

Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting on 1978 document the receipt of the Ailwyn Cup, which was originally awarded as part of the Silver Jubilee celebrations in the previous year, 1977. The original recipient from 1977 was not recorded in the Parish Council minutes but it recorded on the winner's board.



ANY OTHER BUSINESS Ailwyn Cup - Following the presentation of a cup by Lord Ailwyn for village use the chairman said that a policy should be laid down for its future use. Following a discussion of ideas it was agreed to debate the matter at the next meeting in order to announce details at the Parish Meeting.

AILWYN CUP. Ideas for the future use of the Ailwyn Cup did not reach a conclusion and it was decided to raise the matter at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Extract from Parish Council Minutes, 6<sup>th</sup> January 1978

Jubilee Celebrations At the conclusion of the project the accounts of the Jubilee Committee shew an excess of £53.64 after £626.62½ had been raised. This was passed to the Village Hall Committee. The Village Sign was duly handed over to the Parish Council on Jubilee Day. Lord Ailwyn gave a cup to the village, to be known as The Ailwyn Cup and asked that it should be a perpetual trophy within the village.

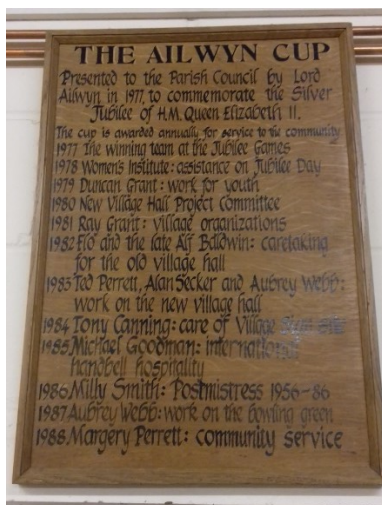
Extract from Parish Council Minutes, Annual Parish Council Meeting, Friday 10<sup>th</sup> March, 1978

Following this in 1978 the Parish Council considered the future of the Ailwyn Cup and how it should be awarded.

AILWYN CUP. The Chairman outlined the Council's proposal that the Cup should be awarded annually to a Village Organisation for a purpose and at the discretion of the Council. Following debate Mr M Smith proposed and Mr J. Hannell seconded the Council scheme is adopted.
